Background information on Urban Future event (themes, issues, context).	We spoke about how crowdsourcing could help influence community and drive institutional accountability. We gave examples of how Safecity and Stop Street Harassment have successfully used crowdsourcing and community engagement to bring about greater awareness of the issue, institutional accountability and change in policies. Open Seventeen supports citizens using crowdsourcing to execute and implement their ideas and map these based on SDGs. Some of the examples were food markets in Chile, mapping water resources in Nigeria and others.
Concise summary of the event proceedings, including key points discussed	We divided the 45 min session in 4 parts. 10 mins to each of the 3 speakers to share about their work and 15 mins from Q and A from the participants. It was a very interactive session with lots of questions on how crowdsourcing can be used in other contexts as well as if crowdsourcing helps to brand areas as "unsafe".
